

Many renewable energy projects approved by the government are st uncertainty as many have so far failed to attract investors.



The Energy and Mineral Resources Ministry's diversified energy dire said from the 75 projects that had power purchase agreements (PPAs eight had started commercial operations.



Meanwhile, 35 projects are still under construction, 30 are in the proreaching financial close (FC), 21 projects are in progress and two hav terminated.

Jakarta, CNN Indonesia -- Kementerian Energi dan Sumber Daya Mineral (ESDM) menyatakan masih ada 19 proyek pembangkit listrik Energi Baru Terbarukan (EBT) yang masih belum mendapatkan sumber pendanaan untuk pembiayaan proyek.

Sebanyak 19 proyek ini merupakan bagian dari 70 lainnya yang sebelumnya terancam mangkrak. 

Tariff determination

Tariff is determined based on PLN's BPP

BPP:

PLN's costs in procuring power from different systems in previous year

For renewable: must "compete" with coal etc

Local BPP > National BPP

* max 85% of local BPP: solar, biomass, biogas, tidal

* max 100% of local BPP: WtE (ex. 12 cities), hydro, geothermal


